1-2-3 Date Nights



"For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh" (Gen 2:24). When a couple lives out this unity, this oneness, with love and respect for each other; it is beautiful! The unity is symbolized by the triangle. The sides of the triangle represent three key points of connection in the marriage relationship: physical, spiritual, and emotional connections. As a couple grows closer in each of these three areas, they grow closer together and a complete ONENESS is the result. They meet each other's physical needs, they are great friends, and they love and serve God together.

"How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity" (Psalms 133:1)! When Christians live out this unity, this oneness, with love and respect for each other, it is beautiful! This unity is also symbolized by the triangle. Physical, emotional (social), and spiritual connections give life and strength to the unity we have in Christ. Joni Beck helped us tie all that together as we talked with her recently.

1-2-3 Date Nights will help couples in our church and community grow in this oneness. One time per month, on the second Saturday of the month, for three hours (6-9 p.m.), we are getting together to eat, have some fun, and get some spiritual/marital insight.

One of the goals is to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace (Ephesians 4:3). This is going to be super! The first 1-2-3 Date Night is May 9. Bring your own food for this one. Bring a game (board or otherwise), bring your spouse (of course), provide your own babysitting for this one (off site), and we'll enjoy this date night together – as one.

As the story continued, I was impressed with the quality and integrity of the crew as well as the Captain.

I kept thinking, “send in the Seals” as the days drug out. As it turned out, that is exactly what happened. The result was the rescue of the Captain, execution of three pirates, and capture of one. It was a display of mercy and justice!

Then I thought about those Navy Seals. Those men are not Seals for fame or fortune. They did not become elite warriors by buying their way in or by a fancy pedigree. They are elite because they paid the price. They have ability, received training, and learned discipline. They know that all of the pain they endure in their training is for the saving of life – theirs and those they are sent to rescue.

God gives each of us certain abilities. He teaches us discipline (we call it *patience*). Each step of our walk with Jesus involves his training process. To what end? It is for the completion of our God-given mission. We are to become fully-devoted followers of Jesus and rescue those enslaved by the evil one.
